Internship Position: Summer Intern

- Rights of non-Muslims in Pakistan
- Human rights issues in Islam
- Role of religion in Pakistani legal system
- Challenges to law enforcement in Pakistan
- Judicial reforms in Pakistan
- Legal education in Pakistan, OR Islamic finance.
- Research assistance includes reviewing articles, books, Pakistani judgments, and interviewing people

Undergraduate and graduate students are eligible to apply. / / English is the official language of Pakistan. Therefore, proficiency in Urdu is not necessary. In case of any language problem, CLP's staff will assist the interns.

Students can join for a period of 4-10 weeks* (note SAI has a minimum of 8 weeks for internship grants). Interns will receive free shared-accommodation, meals, daily pick-and-drop, and out-door medical.
